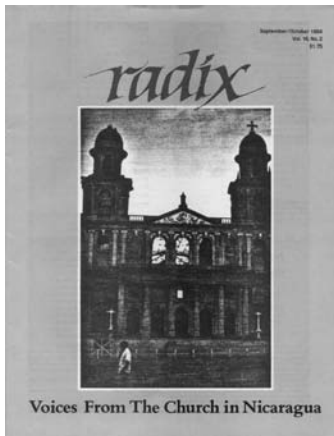

Towel & Basin's founders had a vision—to see Christians serving throughout their entire life-span from youth to young adulthood, middle age and the senior years. Calling Christians of all ages to do as their namesake had done: pick up the towel and basin – that is to say undertake humble, even humiliating acts of service for humankind.

Twenty years later, this vision still guides Towel & Basin purpose to help people and organizations discover their God-given visions for service; develop those callings, and demonstrate excellence in serving.

Founders David Best, Michael Estep and Cecil Paul outlined six ways in which Towel & Basin would endeavor to accomplish its purpose. The notes from the organizational meetings and earliest brochures list these activities as:

- Consulting
- Training
- Volunteering
- Communicating

Still today, these are Towel & Basin's core functions. Frequently serving "behind the scenes," Towel & Basin offers support services, technical assistance, leadership development-multiplication to individuals and groups working with some of the world's most vulnerable people and at-risk communities.

Towel & Basin has served neighborhoods in New York and Nashville, emerging leaders in Kansas City and Kiev. Refugees in Albania and undocumented immigrants in America. Pastors ministering to India's complex cities and compassionate community leaders in Latin America. Christian leaders in Los Angeles and London, Quito and Calcutta; Berlin and Bombay; Manila, Managua and Madras.

For twenty years, those so often left behind, looked over or locked out have found hope, healing and empowerment through the ministries of Towel & Basin and its partners.

And now it is right to give God thanks and praise.

Several events are planned to celebrate these two decades of service. The first ones are scheduled for December, 2004 in Southern California. Recently, Towel & Basin announced a season of remembrance to honor God and give thanks for 20 years of ministry. A number of people took time to write and send us some very gracious, affirming words. We plan to print selections of these in a future edition of *Towel & Basin News*.

But in this issue, allow me to share some excerpts from Towel & Basin's earliest documents that I have reread while reflecting on the past and praying about the future. Here is a sample:

Excerpts from Minutes of Board of Directors' Meeting - June 1-2, 1984

The organizing founders of Towel & Basin met June 1-2, 1984 in Bethany, Oklahoma. Present were Mike Estep, Cecil Paul, and David Best.

The first day was given to a discussion of the purposes and subsequent possible programs of Towel & Basin.

After a lengthy period of brainstorming, conceptualizing and dialogue, the following was formulated as purposes and scope of Towel & Basin (See Attachment #1). [*Editor's note:* Attachment #1 is online at TowelandBasin.org]

The session on Saturday, June 2, focused on issues of organization and incorporation. It was agreed Towel & Basin incorporators would be Mike Estep, Cecil Paul, and David Best. Additional discussion followed about including Steve Pennington and Bob Brower as incorporators or as interested staff.

Discussion of the specific nature of the organization structure included the merit of working with or without an advisory board. (Individuals considered for such a board were Dr. Mark R. Moore, Franklin Cook, Norm Shoemaker, and Don Strong.)

Towel & Basin is finally becoming a "dream come true."

After months of dialogue, dreaming, planning, . . . questioning, searching . . . , Towel & Basin was officially born April 17, 1984. . . . The accomplishments of our first year [are in part:]

Program Director Cecil Paul was instrumental in establishing the Family Care & Enrichment Center in Boston which is now fully operable and functioning on its own.

Editorial Director David Best was involved in an on-site visit to Nicaragua which resulted in the featured issue on Nicaragua in *Radix* magazine. As a result of this effort, *Radix* readers were better informed about the key issues facing the church in the U.S. and Nicaragua.

It has been my privilege to work on structuring the organization and checking out what it is we need to do.

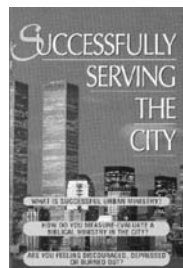
Happy is the Man Who Knows the Lord

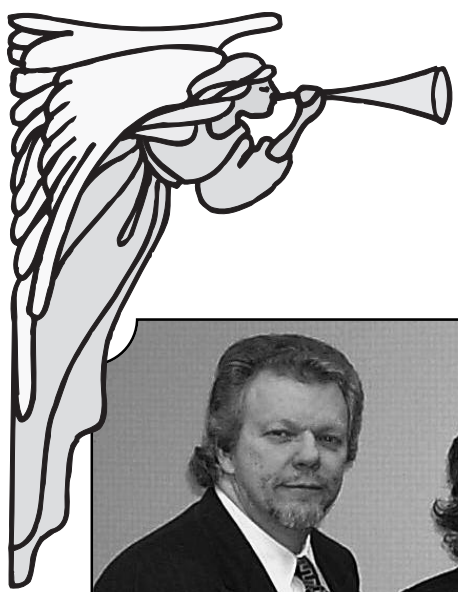

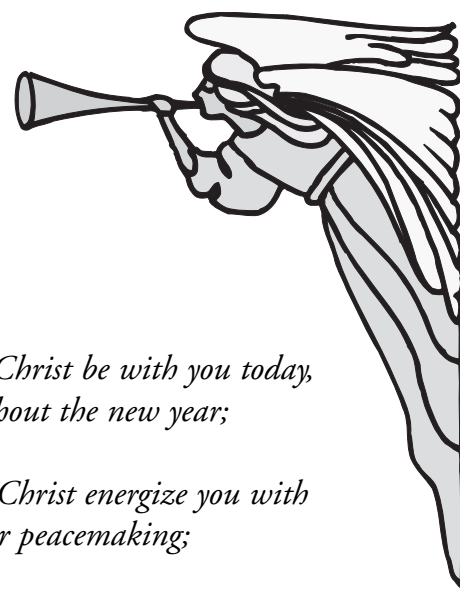
